Keep Your Eyes on Jesus

Fred Snodgrass

Frederick Carlisle "Snow" Snodgrass – was an American baseball player who played for the New York Giants and participated in the 1912 World Series. He is best known for dropping a key fly ball in the 10th inning of the game. Snodgrass who was one of the best center fielders for the National League dropped a routine fly ball that would eventually cost the team a run, the game, and the World Series. The error became known as "Snodgrass's Muff" and the "\$30.000 Muff."

When I was growing up my father used to coach me on how to play tennis, baseball, and basketball. In all of these sports, my father used to always remind me, "Keep your eyes on the ball." Each of these sports required a tremendous amount of concentration in order to be effective and make the play. Whenever I would maintain my focus, I could usually make the play and help the team. However, when I took my eye off the ball, I would watch it go by and wonder what went wrong.

Sometimes in life we seem to lose our focus and take our eyes off the ball. This can result in bad decisions that lead into temptation and even sin. We find ourselves in too much debt or speaking and acting in ways that do not honor Jesus. It is important that we fix our eyes upon Jesus and remain focused on Him and the gospel.
