The Blessings of Sunrise and Sunset

Psalms 113:3 - From the rising of the sun to its setting, the name of the Lord is to be praised!

Psalms 65:8 - ...so that those who dwell at the ends of the earth are in awe at your signs. You make the going out of the morning and the evening to shout for joy.

There is something special and personal about the rising and setting of the sun. When we are on a cruise ship or in an area with open land we can observe the sun as it rises above the horizon to give light to the day and as it descends again below the horizon to mark the end of a day. Each sunrise and set is a sobering reminder of the frailty of life and that our time here on earth is limited and short when compared with eternity. James reminds us in James 4:13-14 - 13 Come now, you who say, "Today or tomorrow we will go into such and such a town and spend a year there and trade and make a profit"— 14 yet you do not know what tomorrow will bring. What is your life? For you are a mist that appears for a little time and then vanishes.

It is wise for us to consider how we will spend each second, minute, hour, and day as the Lord provides in our lives. What are my priorities at the start of the day and then at the end? Are my priorities and actions bringing honor and glory to Jesus or demonstrating my attraction to the world in which all of its trappings will fade away into dust.

How did you start your day this morning? Did you see the sunrise this morning? Sometimes waking up can be the hardest part of the day. Maybe this morning you have a very busy schedule at work, or perhaps you have an important doctor's appointment that will determine your health and quality of life, the dreaded "C" word and cancer. There may be someone reading this today that is in the middle of seeing their family crumbling before their eyes. You no longer feel that strong bond with your spouse, your children seem to find it easier to talk back and look at their phones than to spend time with you. No matter what the circumstances are that you face today – please reflect and meditate on one important FACT. "Jesus Christ is the same yesterday and today and forever." Hebrews 13:8.
