


The Calling of Levi




Tax Collectors

- Luke 19:1-2 He entered Jericho and was passing through. ² And behold, there was a man named Zacchaeus. He was a chief tax collector and was rich.
- Luke 19:5-7 ⁵ And when Jesus came to the place, he looked up and said to him, "Zacchaeus, hurry and come down, for I must stay at your house today." ⁶ So he hurried and came down and received him joyfully. ⁷ And when they saw it, they all grumbled, "He has gone in to be the guest of a man who is a sinner."
- Luke 19:9-10 ⁹ And Jesus said to him, "Today salvation has come to this house, since he also is a son of Abraham. ¹⁰ For the Son of Man came to seek and to save the lost."

Tax collectors in Jesus' time

- In 66 BC, the Zealots burned the archives of Jerusalem where certificates of debt were kept
 - What did this mean for tax collectors?
- Did not have an easy life
- Were presumed to be criminal, as they would take more than was required of them
- The disciple Matthew was a tax collector – Jesus called him to follow him



Jesus – In Levi's House

• Mark 2:15 - ¹⁵ And as he reclined at table in his house, many tax collectors and sinners were reclining with Jesus and his disciples, for there were many who followed him.

• Mark 2:16 - ¹⁶ And the scribes of the Pharisees, when they saw that he was eating with sinners and tax collectors, said to his disciples, "Why does he eat with tax collectors and sinners?"



God Shows No Favoritism

- Romans 3:23 ²³ for all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God,
- Acts 10:34-35 ³⁴ So Peter opened his mouth and said: "Truly I understand that God shows no partiality, ³⁵ but in every nation anyone who fears him and does what is right is acceptable to him.
- 1 Corinthians 10:12 Therefore let anyone who thinks that he stands take heed lest he fall.
